OFFICER SERVICE UNIFORMS



The service "A" uniform includes the service coat. When the service "A" uniform is prescribed as the uniform of the day, it is appropriate to remove the coat in office buildings within the confines of a military activity or establishment. The service "A" uniform is authorized for leave and liberty.

The service "B" uniform is the same as the service "A" uniform except that the service coat is not worn. The long-sleeve khaki shirt is worn with the appropriate necktie and necktie clasp/necktab. This uniform may be worn as the uniform of the day and for leave and liberty, unless otherwise prescribed by the commander, and may be prescribed for formations at parades or ceremonies on and off the military activity. This uniform will not be worn for formal or semi-formal social events.

The short-sleeve khaki shirt with appropriate service trousers or skirt/slacks is designated as the service "C" uniform. During the winter season, commanders may, at their discretion when the weather requires, authorize the service "C" uniform. This uniform may be worn as a uniform of the day and for leave or liberty, unless otherwise prescribed by the commander, and may be prescribed for formations at parades or ceremonies on and off the military activity. This uniform will not be worn for formal or semiformal social events.

There are three different variations of the Dress uniform: Evening Dress, Blue Dress, and Blue-White Dress; only officers and SNCO (Staff Non-Commissioned Officer's) are authorized to wear the evening dress.

The service "B" uniform is the same as the service "A" uniform except that the service coat is not worn. The long-sleeve khaki shirt is worn with the appropriate necktie and necktie clasp/necktab. This uniform may be worn as the uniform of the day and for leave and liberty, unless otherwise prescribed by the commander, and may be prescribed for formations at parades or ceremonies on and off the military activity. This uniform will not be worn for formal or semi-formal social events.

The short-sleeve khaki shirt with appropriate service trousers or skirt/slacks is designated as the service "C" uniform. During the winter season, commanders may, at their discretion when the weather requires, authorize the service "C" uniform. This uniform may be worn as a uniform of the day and for leave or liberty, unless otherwise prescribed by the commander, and may be prescribed for formations at parades or ceremonies on and off the military activity. This uniform will not be worn for formal or semiformal social events.

Enlisted Marines are authorized gratuitous alterations not to exceed 50% of the price of the item sold or issued.

OFFICER OR ENLISTED MALE & FEMALE ALL WEATHER COAT



- Determining Length: a point midway between the knee and mid-calf. The coat must be long enough to reach the bottom of the kneecap 1 inch below for females. It must not extend below the mid-calf.
- Wear: The coat's top button may be worn buttoned or may be left open with the collar neatly folded back to form lapels.
- The AWC may be worn with service, dress, and utility uniforms. It may be worn with or without the liner at the individual's option.

PT & UTILITY UNIFORMS



Commanders may prescribe the utility uniform as the uniform of the day, in accordance with the below guidance. The uniform is authorized for parades, reviews or other ceremonies, and informal social functions. The utility coat may be removed only for physical training and work details. When the Marine Corps Combat Utility Uniform is worn during the summer season the woodland Marine Pattern (MARPAT) with the sleeves rolled up will be worn. When the MCCUU is worn during the winter season the woodland MARPAT will be worn with the sleeves down.

The MCCUU is a working uniform and not appropriate for wear in a civilian environment. Wear of the MCCUU is authorized while commuting to and from work via privately owned vehicles. However, en-route stops while off-base are not authorized except for bonafide emergencies, such as medical emergencies, vehicle breakdown, or vehicle accidents. Marines and Sailors may only wear the MCCUU at off base establishments when using drive-thru services such as ATMs, fast food restaurants, or dry cleaners when they do not exit the vehicle.

UNIFORM CARE

Marine Corps Combat Utility

- 1. Washing: Machine Wash using Permanent Press Cycle or hand wash using mild detergent that does not contain optical brighteners. Rinse completely. Do not use chlorine bleach.
- 2. Drying: Tumble dry and remove immediately from dyer. To drip dry, remove from water and place on hanger.
- 3. Ironing: Light ironing if needed. Do not starch or commercially hot press.

Khaki Shirts

- Dry Clean or launder by hand.
- Bleach, fabric softener, dryer sheets, starch and hot water will harm the fabric of the shirt.

Dress Blue & Service Green Coats Pressing Instructions

- 1. Avoid pressing dry or with too hot an iron.
- 2. Remove all gloss from edges and seams by pressing with damp cloths.
- 3. Crease only lower three-fourths of sleeves.

Dress Blue & Service Green Trouser Care

Professional dry clean only.

All Weather Coat

- Professional dry clean only.
- After each dry cleaning, retreat coat for water repellency.

Service Green Coat (intended to be semi-formfitting) & Dress Blue Coat (intended to be formfitting)

Fitting: The Service Coat shall be fitted over the shirt and trouser, with the coat fastened and the belt secured. The Dress Coat shall be fitted over the undershirt and trouser, with the web belt center front. The waist seam of the coat shall fall over the top edge of the web belt on the trouser with a variance of plus or minus ½ inch allowable. The length of the coat must extend below the crotch line approximately ¾ inch.

- 1. The collar of the Dress Coat shall have $\frac{1}{2}$ to 1 inch of ease.
- 2. All other fitting information is for both the Service and Dress Coats.
- 3. The back of the coat shall hang smoothly, with the rear vent and back seam effecting a straight vertical line.
- 4. The coat has been designed so that when the waist seam is fitted directly on top of the web belt, a proper length for the coat will be attained. A coat of excessive length tends to cause the rear vent to flare open, while a coat of insufficient length may create an excessive front overlap.
- 5. The horizontal edges of the front and rear panels shall be even; however, a tolerance of 1/4 inch is acceptable.
- 6. The collar shall fit comfortably at the back. The shoulder padding of the coat should extend approximately ½ inch beyond the outer edge of the shoulder joint, thereby providing a straight appearance with the upper part of the sleeve. There should be no constrictive binding at the armhole.
- 7. The Service and Dress Coats should rest easily on the chest, without bulges. The front collar and lapels of the Service Coat should give a smooth appearance.
- 8. The left side of the front closure should overlap the right side approximately 3 to 4 inches.
- 9. The coast sleeve shall extend to a point 1 inch above the second join from the end of the thumb, plus or minus ¼ inch and must cover the shirt cuff edge.

- 10. The design of the coat calls for a flared skirt to permits ease of movement. If flare is excessive and adversely affects the overall appearance, it shall be decreased. A gathering of up to 1 inch of material on both of the side seams of the flare is allowable.
- 11. The left side of the back vent shall overlap the right side approximately 3 to 4 inches. In some cases, the profile of the individual precludes obtaining the minimum overlap. In those cases, a minimum of 1 ½ inch overlap is permissible, providing the vertical edge of the vent closure is straight.
- 12. There should be sufficient fullness in the fit of the Service Coat to allow 1 inch fold under each arm to provide a total of 2 inches of fullness in the chest area. The belt shall be adjusted to 2 to 2 ³/₄ inches in length past the buckle edge. Slight wrinkles at the belt line are permissible. In the Dress Coat, there shall be 1 inch fullness in the chest and ¹/₂ inch fullness in the waist.

Alterations: note that altering the Service Coat to a form fitting garment is prohibited.

- 1. **Shoulders**: Raising or lowering the shoulders eliminates wrinkles and folds in the back and below the shoulders of the coat and compensates for the uneven shoulder heights. It consists of adding shoulder padding to raise the shoulders or removing existing padding to lower the shoulders.
- 2. Waist and hip: Taking in or letting out the side seams should be done only after the next larger size or smaller size has been tried. Front buttons may be repositioned not to exceed ¼ inch for further refinement of fit.
- 3. Sleeves: When lengthening or shortening sleeves is desired, make certain each sleeve is measured and marked. When shortening the sleeve, the sleeve cuff shall be removed, cut the bottom of the sleeve to the desired length, then replace the sleeve cuff. If lengthening the sleeve, remove the cuff, add to the bottom of each sleeve a strip of basic material equal to the amount of length that is desired, then replace the cuff at the bottom of the sleeve. The sleeve can be lengthened as much as 2 inches.
- 4. **Collar**: In the case of long or short necks, raising or lowering the collar improves the fit and appearance. This alteration is performed by removing the under collar and liner top collar stitching, then repositioning for proper fit. Re-stitch the collar in its new position, then press. Collar must not be raised or lowered over 3/8 inch.

Trousers, Men's Service Green, Dress Blue, & Dress White

General Information: The Service Green, Dress Blue, and Dress White trousers are sized from 30 up in three lengths: Short, Regular, and Long. The only difference in the S, R, and L for any size is the rise and length. Trousers are furnished with unfinished leg bottoms but with the intended 3 inch hem turned up included in the inseam measurement.

Ornamental Stripes: The ornamental or scarlet stripes for Dress Blue slacks shall be positioned on the rear pane of the trouser with the front edge of the stripe 1/15 to 1/8 inch on the outseam and stitched to the trouser from the top of the fronts to the lower end of the pocket opening 1/8 inch from each edge of the stripe. The stitching is to continue to the bottom edge of the leg, with the stripe gradually worked toward the front panel of the slacks so that the stripe is centered over the outseam. The top of the stripe is to finish at or in the waist seam and the bottom end of the stripe is to be turned up in the hem.

Fitting: Trousers shall be fitted over the appropriate undergarment and fitted in an individual's hip and waist measurement and height. An individual 5'3" and shorter will normally near a Short; 5'4" to 5'8" a Regular, and 5'9" or taller a Long length. The trouser shall normally be fitted according to the hip measurement and then the waist measurement in priority.

- 1. **Waist**. The hip measurement is primary since the waist may be taken in, let out. or lowered as required.
- 2. Rise. The trouser must fit without looseness or constriction. A short rise results in tightness and discomfort in the seat area; long rise results in a baddy seat and crotch, which results in an unsightly appearance. The bottom of the waistband should be atop of the hipbone, plus or minus ½ inch.
- 3. When decreasing the seat and/or waist, pay particular attention to the fit of the crotch and ensure that the slide fastener is centered on the side and not too far back that the front slide fastener is not distorted.
- 4. Hem. The maximum authorized hem shall be 3 inches. Facing material may be used for hems of 1 inch or less.
- 5. Length. The trouser shall be of sufficient length to reach the juncture of the welt of the shoe in the rear. A variation of ½ above the welt is acceptable. The unfinished hem of the leg of the trouser shall be marked on the bias. When the slacks have been properly hemmed, they must hang straight from the seat so that the front length should finish ¾ to 1 inch shorter than the back.

Women's Fit & Tailoring Guide For USMC Uniforms

The Service Green and Dress Blue Coats are available in a range of sizes from XO to 18 and come in three lengths: Short, Regular, and Long (S, R, and L). The S, R, and L in any particular size vary only in garment and sleeve length. For any given size, the bust and shoulder measurements are the same for S, R, and L.

The bust area is the most difficult part of the coat to alter, so it is of prime importance that the individual be fitted to a coat which most closely corresponds to her bust measurement if at all possible. In some cases, the contour of the back can take away the necessary bust area, and the front will not lay smoothly over the bust. The situation may often be corrected by altering the back of the coat.

The shoulders are the next most important area of the coat to alter. The shoulders support the way the entire coat will hang, so it is essential that the shoulders be fitted properly with the fabric smoothly molded over the shoulders.

In individual will normally wear the same size in the Green Service and Dress Blue Coats, but it is important that the fitting of each coat be considered separately. (intended to be semi formfitting)

Service Green & Dress Blue Coat

Fitting (all types): The fully buttoned coat shall be fitted over the skirt and shirt. The coat is fitted first for bust size and then by shoulder fit. The coat should fit smoothly but not tightly across the bust and shoulders. The individual should be able to move both arms freely. The back of the coat should fit smoothly. Because of the many different body types, it is not always possible to have a coat which will present a perfectly smooth fitting front and back. When this is the case, a decision must be made as to which is the most desirable. Generally, it is preferable to have a smooth appearance in the back.

- Back: The entire back should mold smoothly over the back from the neck to hem edge, with no wrinkles in the waist area. If the back wrinkles, the same size coat in a shorter length should be tried. If the waist of the garment is too high above the natural waist line, the same size coat in a longer length should be tried. In obtaining a coat of proper length to accomplish a smooth fitting back, the bottom may vary from the waistline.
- 2. The design of the coat calls for a flared skirt to permit ease of movement. Flares that are considered excessive and adversely affect the overall appearance shall be decreased. A gathering of up to 1 inch of material on both side seams is allowable.
- 3. The left side of the back vent shall overlap the right side approximately 3 to 4 inches. In some case. The profile of the individual precludes obtaining the minimum overlap. In such cases, a minimum of 1 1/2 inch overlap is permissible, provided the vertical edge of the vent closure is straight.

- 4. Front: The coat should fit smoothly over the bust without strain and without blousing at the waist. If the coat does blouse at the waistline, a shorter coat in the same size may be necessary. The coat should easily fit through the waist, extending to a smooth flare over the hips, allowing the 2 inch overlap in the center to hang evenly.
- 5. **Shoulder**: The shoulder should be fitted so that the shoulder edge of the garment does not extend beyond the natural shoulder edge. The should seam should rest directly on top of the shoulders.
- 6. **Sleeves**: The sleeves should fit smoothly when the arm hangs straight at the side. The sleeve length should be approximately 1 inch above the second joint from the end of the thumb and of sufficient length to cover the long-sleeved shirt.
- 7. Length: The old style coat should be of sufficient length to cover the skirt zipper, e.g., 1/4 inch below the skirt zipper or 7 inches below the natural waistline. The length of the new style coat with rear vent is determined by the height of the individual being fitted and may vary due to body type.
- 8. Collar: The collar should fit smoothly and closely at the back of the neck.

Alterations (all types): Alterations may be made on all seams for a maximum of 1 1/2 inch increase or decrease in garment size. Seams may be taken in or let out along only a portion of the seam. The length of the coat will not be changed.

- 1. **Back**. Back seams may be taken in and side seams may be taken in or let out to accomplish a smooth molded appearance.
- 2. Front. Front and side seams may be taken in or let out to accomplish a smooth appearance.
- 3. Shoulders.

a. **Sloping Shoulders**. A slight case of sloping shoulders will cause wrinkles to appear near the bust, at the armhole, and across the end of the shoulder in the back may be corrected by the use of shoulder pads. If this does not correct the wrinkles, the sleeves must be taken out and the excess fabric removed at the shoulders, tapering it down to the neckline. The armhole then must be lowered the same amount as the fabric removed at the shoulder.

b. **Square Shoulders**. The regular stock size, when put on a customer with square shoulders, is apt to show a break or fold across the back, directly below the collar. Usually the collar correction may be made by simply replacing the heavy shoulder pad with a lighter one. If the fault is greater, then the collar should be removed from collar notch to collar notch. Take in 3/8 inch at the neck point on the front and back shoulder and lower the neckline at the back 3/8 inch to retain the same circumference of the neck and gorge, then replace collar.

4. Sleeves:

- a. Coat, Woman's Service Green. When lengthening or b. shortening is desired, make certain each sleeve is measured and marked. When shortening the sleeve, the sleeve cuff shall be removed, cut the bottom of the sleeve to the desired length, then replace the cuff. When lengthening the sleeve, remove the cuff, add to the bottom of each sleeve a strip of basic material equal to the amount of the length desired, and then replace the cuff. The sleeves can be lengthened as much as 2 inches.
- b. Coat, Woman's Dress Blue. When lengthening or shortening sleeves is desired, make certain each sleeve is measured and marked. Remove the sleeve ornamental cuff, mark the sleeve the desired length, reposition the sleeve ornamental cuff at the mark, and stitch back on the sleeve. The sleeve can be lengthened as much as 2 inches. If longer than 2 inches is required, the bottom of the sleeve must be faced with basic material to make the new hem turn up.
- 5. Buttons: Buttons may be moved only to the left and not more than 3/8 inch.

Skirts, Service Green, Dress Blue, & Dress White

Note: The Service Green, Dress Blue, and Dress White Skirts are constructed from the same basic pattern and the fitting and alteration requirements are the same for all items. When fitting the new style skirt with the rear kick pleat, particular attention shall be given to having the correct length skirt since the rear vent should not be shortened in excess of 1 inch without trying on a different length skirt.

General Information. All three skirts are available in a range of sizes from XO to 18 in three lengths: Short, Regular, and Long (S, R, L). The only difference in the S, R, L for any size is 1 1/2 inch difference in length. The waist and hip measurements are the same within each size.

Fitting: Skirts shall be fitted over the appropriate undergarments and fitted according to an individual's hip and waist measurements and height. An individual 5'3" and shorter will normally wear a Short; 5'4" to 5'6" wears a Regular; and 5'7" and taller wear will wear a Long. The skirt shall normally be fitted according to the hip measurement and then the waist measurement in priority

- 1. **Hips**: The skirt should mold smoothly but not tightly over the hips. If the skirt is too tight around the hips, the next larger size should be used, since the waistline can be taken in, if necessary.
- 2. Waist: The waistline should fit easily and not tightly.
- 3. Side Seams. Side seams must be centered at the sides and hang straight from the waistline to the hem.
- 4. Length: The length of the skirt shall be one which is appropriate for the appearance of the uniform and the appearance of the individual; however, skirts shall be knee length (not more than 1 inch above the top of the knee cap or more than 1 inch below the bottom of the knee cap).

Slacks, Women's Service Green, Dress Blue, & Dress White

Note: The Service Green, Dress Blue, and Dress White Slacks are constructed from the same basic pattern and the fitting and alteration requirements are the same for all items.

General Information. The Service Green, Dress Blue, and Dress White Slacks are available in a range of sizes from XO to 18 in three lengths: Short, Regular, and Long. The only difference in the S, R, and L for any size is the rise and length. The waist and hip measurements are the same. Slacks are furnished with unfinished leg bottoms but with the intended 3 inch hem turn-up included in the inseam measurement.

Ornamental Stripes. The ornamental or scarlet stripes for Dress Blue slacks shall be positioned on the rear pane of the slacks with the front edge of the stripe 1/15 to 1/8 inch on the outseam and stitched to the slacks from the top of the fronts to the lower end of the pocket opening 1/8 inch from each edge of the stripe. The stitching is to continue to the bottom edge of the leg, with the stripe gradually worked toward the front panel of the slacks so that the stripe is centered over the outseam. The top of the stripe is to finish at or in the waist seam and the bottom end of the stripe is to be turned up in the hem.

Fitting: Slacks shall be fitted over the appropriate undergarment and fitted in an individual's hip and waist measurement and height. An individual 5'3" and shorter will normally wear a Short; 5'4" to 5'8" a Regular, and 5'9" or taller a Long length. The slacks shall normally be fitted according to the hip measurement and then the waist measurement in priority.

- 1. **Waist**. The hip measurement is primary since the waist may be taken in, let out, or lowered as required.
- Rise. The slacks must fit without looseness or constriction. A short rise results in tightness and discomfort in the seat area; long rise results I a baddy seat and crotch, which results in an unsightly appearance. The bottom of the waistband should be atop of the hipbone, plus or minus 1/2 inch.
- 3. When decreasing the seat and/or waist, pay particular attention to the fit of the crotch and ensure that the slide fastener is centered on the side and not too far back on old style slacks and that the front slide fastener is not distorted in the new style slacks.
- 4. **Hem.** The maximum authorized hem shall be 3 inches. Facing material may be used for hems of 1 inch or less.
- 5. Length. The slacks shall be of sufficient length to reach the juncture of the welt of the shoe I the rear. A variation of 1/2 above the welt is acceptable. The unfinished hem of the leg of the slack shall be marked on the bias as shown in Figure 2-8. When the slacks have been properly hemmed, they must hang straight from the seat so that the front length should finish 3/4 to 1 inch shorter than the back.

Shirts, Woman's Long and Short Sleeve

General Information. The short sleeve shirt is issued in khaki only. The shirts are available in a range of sizes from XO to 18, in Short, Regular, and Long lengths. The Short, Regular, and Long length in any particular size varies in the sleeve length, collar size, waist length, and full length; and not in the bust or shoulder measurements. The shirt collars are designed to be worn open or closed.

Fitting: The shirt is designed as a semi formfitting garment. The shirt should fit smoothly over the bust and be comfortable through the shoulders. The armholes should not bind. The priority of the fitting is the bust, hips, waist, shoulders, and sleeves (long sleeve only). With the size range available, little or no alteration should be required if fitting priorities are followed.

- 1. The shirt should fit smoothly over the bust without strain and blousing at the waist. If the shirt blouses at the waistline, a shorter shirt of the same size may be necessary. The shirt should fit smoothly over the upper hip and not ride up or be too loose.
- 2. The shoulder seams shall not extend beyond the natural shoulder line. If the shoulder seams hang off the shoulders, the next smaller size should be fitted.
- 3. Sleeves. The sleeve length of the short sleeved shirts should be the right length if the proper size shirt is being worn. The bottom edge of the cuff on the long sleeved shirt shall cover the wrist bone to a point 2 inches above the second joint from the end of the thumb.

Alterations:

- 1. Side: front, and back seams may be taken in as necessary to produce the required semi formfitted appearance.
- 2. The long sleeves may be shortened, although altering the sleeve length by less than 1/2 inch is not authorized as sleeve lengths vary only 1 inch between Short, Regular, and Long lengths and 1/2 inch between numeric sizes.
